I. Biography

Matthew Vincent Taylor, “an unorthodox fellow whose brilliance is neither accidental nor passing”, is an interdisciplinary artist and Chief, Artistic Director, of his formalized Fracturate Atlas non-for-profit: The F.art Company, or The Fine Art Company. Since 2003—when, at the age of seven, his first choral music session was published—he has cultivated two decades of professional and academic arts experience between Nashville and New York City, spanning session singing, dance, theater, comedy, and new satellite media propagation.

Matthew earned his BFA in Dance from NYU Tisch School of the Arts on a full merit-based scholarship in 2018, choreographing the most works in his graduating class and serving as a teacher’s assistant in a contemporary partnering pedagogy study from 2016–2017. While at NYU, he also served as a Welcome Week Captain through NYU’s Center for Student Life, overseeing teams, organizing events for groups ranging from 10 to 15,000 people, and fostering a welcoming environment for new students. He later continued his education at the graduate level through NYU Steinhardt’s ABT Ballet Pedagogy program, deepening his training in the American Ballet Theatre curriculum and expanding his work as a dance educator.

As the Chief, Artistic Director, of The F.art Company (est. 2018), a Fractured Atlas non-profit dedicated to recalibrating societal norms through lineage, movement, comedy, and media. Matthew has coordinated performances and community events with artists from HBO, CBS, New York Comedy Festival, and The Upright Citizens Brigade Theatre New York where he interned, 2019-2020; he has also been apart of the Advanced Sketch Writing Program since pre-pandemic. His performance credits include collaborations with Crystal Pite (Kidd Pivot), Second Avenue Dance Company, Josh Prince (Dance Lab New York), Mandy Moore (So You Think You Can Dance), MADBOOTS dance, Warren Carlyle (Astaire Awards), Whitney Browne, and The Caravaglia Photo Studio, appearing on stages such as Carnegie Hall, New York City Center, Radio City Music Hall, The Joyce Theater, Jack Crystal Theater, New York University Skirball Center, and Paper Mill Playhouse.

Now in 2025, since studying and interning at The Upright Citizens Brigade Theater New York, Matthew has fused theatricality, choreography, and comedy into socially conscious work, with projects like *Hypocrites Welcome*, the scentient, *F.A.R.T.S LIVE!*, & *Finagling with Feminism*. By chance, Mr. Tersebashian's artistic process deepened when comedy and dance completed each other—each holding what the other lacked, creating a whole greater than its parts. That is how paradox captivated him; he has been a captive audience ever since. For Matthew, “Paradox is Holy Shit”: not a contradiction to be erased, but a union of opposites to be embraced—where order needs chaos, tradition sharpens innovation, and humor deepens gravity. This philosophy runs through his work as a dancer, vocalist, actor, photographer, content editor, choreographer, comedian, and writer, with each discipline informing the others, underscoring his commitment to the Marcelian patience required for paradox and constitution to flourish into Ciceroian craft.

III. Online Work

Choreographic Research Archive (2018 – Ongoing) — Digital Video Series (25+ works across YouTube, Instagram, and Facebook)

A continuing “season” within *The F.art Company*’s online canon, documenting casual explorations in contemporary and choreographic movement from The East Village in Manhattan. Each entry functions as embodied research—an unfiltered study of gesture, rhythm, and human design. The series positions dance as a broadcast form, equal in scope to the Company’s web, podcast, and social media projects.

Something 2 Celebrate (2019 – 2023)

Instagram Series — 27 episodes

A satellite-media experiment merging humor, movement, and social commentary. Each episode blends micro-performance, character study, and visual rhythm to explore celebration as both social impulse and survival tactic. The series established The F.art Company’s visual language and online audience.

Talking 2 Strangers (2022)

Web Series — 27 episodes

Conversational performance work in which spontaneous encounters become miniature studies in empathy and communication. The series treats dialogue itself as choreography—examining how tone, timing, and vulnerability create human connection across differences.

Hypocrites Welcome (2022)

RSS Podcast — 14 episodes

A “walk-and-talk” philosophical podcast produced under The F.art Company banner. The show investigates contradiction as an art form, using movement, humor, and conversation to navigate social tension and personal belief. It completes the auditory dimension of the Company’s triadic structure (Live / Online / Print).

A body of visual, photographic, and mixed-media collage works prepared for museum and gallery exhibition, extending The F.art Company’s aesthetic inquiry into visual form and conceptual composition.

- **Career momentum was interrupted by the COVID-19 pandemic**, halting live performance and prompting a pivot toward digital media, writing, and interdisciplinary creation.
